



# **Cherub Association of Western Australia** **2011/12 STATE CHAMPIONSHIP REGATTA** **NOTICE OF RACE**

## **1.0 Rules**

- The 2011/12 Cherub State Championship Regatta will be governed by the rules and restrictions of the Cherub National Council of Australia (CNCA) (except where altered by the sailing instruction) and the sailing instructions.

## **2.0 Alteration of Class Rules**

- Class rules shall not be altered.

## **3.0 Eligibility and Entry**

- 3.1 The regatta is open to all Cherub Class Yachts.
- 3.2 Yachts entering must complete the attached registration form and lodge on or before 19<sup>th</sup> November 2011 with:

- 3.3 There shall be no restriction on the number of starters.

## **4.0 Fees**

- Entry is free to all financial members of the CAWA.
- Yachts MUST be financial members of the CAWA in order to compete.
  - \$110.00 per boat for registration before the 19<sup>th</sup> November 2011
  - \$120.00 per boat for registration on the 19<sup>th</sup> November 2011

## **5.0 Schedule of Events**

- 5.1 Registration
  - Saturday 19/11/2011, at 1000, Mounts Bay Sailing Club
- 5.2 Measurement
  - Measuring will be conducted on all sails, spars, foils and/or hulls as required on the 19/11/2011, 1000. Yachts with existing measurement certificates shall not require measuring.

## **6.0 Measurement**

- Yachts shall comply with the CNCA Rules and Restrictions.
- Competitors are reminded of rules 5, 6 and 7 stating that only one set of sails, spars and foils may be used in a contest.
- All boats MUST have safety equipment as required by the CNCA and host clubs.

## **7.0 Sailing Instructions**

- Sailing instructions and courses will be available to competitors from host clubs on race days.
- Pre-race briefings will be provided by the class captain or nominated representative of the respective clubs prior to racing.

## **8.0 Courses**

- Courses will be sailed in accordance with the sailing instructions issued by the respective clubs.
- With permission from the respective clubs some courses may be altered to form windward – leeward courses.

## **9.0 Scoring**

- The Low Point scoring system (RRS Appendix A) will apply.
- Each competing yacht shall be eligible to drop their two worst heats on the basis that all 8 heats are sailed in the State Championship Regatta. If 5 or less heats are sailed then there shall be no drops.

## **10.0 Alternative Penalties**

- The 360 degree turns penalty shall apply.

## **11.0 Crew**

- The skipper and crew nominated on the entry form shall not be changed without written permission of the Race Committee.

## **12.0 Liability**

- The Cherub Association of WA, Perth Dinghy Sailing Club, Mounts Bay Sailing Club, The Cruising Yacht Club, Koombana Bay Sailing Club and the South of Perth Yacht Club, their officers, members and volunteers do not accept liability for the loss of life or property, personal injury or damage caused before, during or after this regatta.
- The establishment of the sailing instructions in no way limits or reduces the complete and unlimited responsibilities of a competitor being solely responsible for the management of his or her yacht.
