Veterans Day at the Nationals

It was "Veterans Day", at the end of the Adelaide Nationals with Trevor Fav and Nathan Chipchase from Belmont 16ft Skiff Club sailing The French Tickler winning both the Open Championship and the Veteran's trophy. For Trevor it was his fourth nationals win. The NSW pair's win was far from easy. Prior to the last race they had not recorded a race win and the pointscore gave them only a narrow lead over eventual second placegetters Neil How and Alex Bath sailing Monster and Perth crew Ben Lawrie and Geoff Longwood in Busted Football.

When the fleet started the Invitation Race there

would have been few participants who would have expected a series in which the conditions would vary so wildly. The Invitation Race itself was sailed in a steady 15 kt breeze and was taken out by Cam Rule and Cain McVee from Mounts Bay Sailing Club in *The Cunning Linguist*.

When the series started the conditions changed significantly. The first two days of racing were completed in very light airs with the PRO struggling to set courses short enough to complete racing. The two heats on Day One and the single race on Day Two each started in light conditions and finished in close to drifts. Race Two

was so slow that only two of the fleet were able to make the line before the wind died completely. causing all the remaining boats to DNF missing the on time limit. This occurred even through some of the boats had only a few hundred metres to sail in the 30 minutes following he winner finishing. As a result of this race several boats protested the Race Committee over the fairness of the result. The outcome of the protest was that all the nonfinishers were awarded average points for the race.

In these three light races Belmont brothers Brett and

Ryan Lancaster sailing Causing Haavik showed outstanding speed and great light weather skill to record three straight wins. If the conditions were to stay light for the remainder of the regatta they looked likely winners. But this was not to be the case.

Following the New Years Day lay day conditions completely turned about. The next three races, over two days of racing, were held in very fresh 20+kts south westerly breezes, causing a major turnaround in the results with many of the heavier and more experienced crews coming to the fore. Ashley Knighton, sailing with defending champion Rhys Mara in Rope City, relished the fresher breezes recording one win, a second and a fifth place. Similarly Steve and Blake Vance in Serenity Now from Perth Dinghy Sailing Club recorded a win and two fourth places. In this shake-up three crews stood out having managed to score well in both the light and the heavy going. No surprise that it was these three crews that took out the top three overall places. Fay and Chipchase, local Largs Bay team of How and Bath and, Lawrie and Longwood each managed to record solid places in both light and heavy.

With the last race to be sailed in more moderate conditions Fay and Chipchase had the challenge of staying in front of How and Bath to take the series. Carefully playing the shifts up the first work Fay and Chipchase built a considerable lead at the top mark with leading woman skipper Claire Lunsmann in

Alchemy second and How and Bath third. At that stage the series looked to be in keeping for Fay and Chipchase. However How and Bath did not give up and chipped away at the lead. On the final downwind leg How and Bath had sailed very deep and slow in the lighter breeze. Fay and Chipchase had sailed a higher faster course searching for a freshening breeze on the left. At the bottom mark the final time the lead was down to a few metres, but Fay and Chipchase held their margin up the last work to take the race and the series.

Winner of the Junior Championship were the Lancaster brothers whose performance was outstanding given that it is their first season in Cherubs. Kris Fay and Liam Doyle from Belmont took the Cadet trophy.

The French Tickler is the first non-Matthews design to win the Nationals since 1999. Its hull shell is a modified Lairy Canary design originally built by Dallas Blatchford (and sons) in 2002. Over this last winter Dallas, with assistance from Nigel Blatchford and Trevor Fay, completely stripped the hull shell rebuilding all the frames decks and floor. The result was effectively a new boat with flat decks, laid out in a similar way to Trevor Fay's previous boat, dual National Champion, Wally.


